

Clue 3:

Sew a 2" medium strip to a 2" light strip to make a strip set.

Press the seam toward the medium.

Make 11 of these strip sets.

Cut the strip sets into 2" sections.

You will need 224 sections. If your fabrics are less than 42" long you will have to cut extra 2" squares from your scraps.

The cutting goes faster if you cut two strip sets at once. Place them right sides together with seam allowances going in opposite directions.

Label these pieces Clue 3.



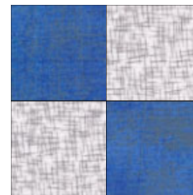
Clue 4:

Use two pieces from Clue 3 to make a four-patch unit.

Make 88 four-patches.

You will NOT use all the pieces from Clue 3.

Label the four-patch units Clue 4.



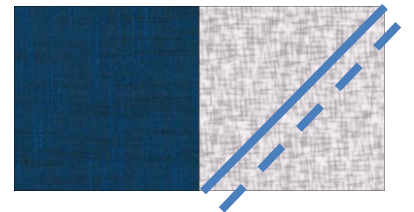
Clue 5:

Folded corner technique – place a small square on the corner of a rectangle. Sew on the diagonal of the small square. Press the inner flap out to match the corner of the larger square. Unfold the flap and cut away the two layers of fabric at the corner.

Make 48 of these using a dark rectangle and a light square.

Make 48 of these using an accent rectangle and a light square.

Label them Clue 5.



The direction of the angle is important. Do not sew it in the opposite direction.

Clue 6:

Join a dark and an accent unit from Clue 5.

Press seam toward the accent.

Make 48 of these and label them Clue 6.
